



[EUMERGENCIES] Call for EUMERGENCIES exchanges

Call for application

The mobility of researchers is an important condition for the exchange of knowledge and innovative research. The EUMERGENCIES exchanges are a research mobility scheme that aims to promote interactions between the JMCE and foreign universities by funding short-term visits (up to three months). It will support collaborative research projects.

The exchanges are open to **junior and senior researchers** who wish to make a scientific stay **IN** or **OUT**.

People concerned will be:

- Foreign researchers interested in the EUMERGENCIES project and willing to visit the IEE in order to collaborate with the JMCE academic staff in at least one of the research thematic axes (**IN**).
- Researchers from UCLouvain interested in the EU Studies willing to collaborate with foreign research centres and universities in research domains covered by the EUMERGENCIES projects (**OUT**).

Selection criteria



Candidates' selection is based on the relevance of their research project in relation to the EUMERGENCIES research domains.

How to apply?

Applicants are required to submit:

- A **cover letter** demonstrating the relevance of the research stay in the host university and how the proposed research relates to EUMERGENCIES
- A **curriculum vitae**

Applications had to be submitted **at least three months before** the planned research stay to the following contacts:

Researchers participating in the SSSG scheme are covered by a **mobility agreement** concluded between the sending and host universities.

Outputs expected?

At the conclusion of their research stay, EUMERGENCIES exchanges recipients are expected either:

- to present their research in the framework of the **EUMERGENCIES Seminar Series** and/ or,
- to contribute to the **Unmuting Europe podcast series** on a topic related to EUMERGENCIES themes.

Legacy of the EUNMUTE Centre of Excellence (2022-2025)

The current mobility opportunities build upon the successful Scientific Short Stay Grant (SSSG) scheme established by our previous Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence, EUNMUTE.

This work was led by key figures such as **Sophie Jacquot**, whose research has significantly advanced the study of gender and equality policies within the EU, and **Amandine Orsini**, who has explored how younger generations are redefining global environmental priorities.
